Nicholas was a native and lifelong resident of Martinez, GA. Nick attended Lakeside High School and was a member of Cub Scout Pack 182 and Boy Scout Troop 182. He started Scouting at the age of 6 and was a Life Scout, earning over 50 merit badges, and was nearing the completion of his quest for Eagle Scout recognition. He had held virtually every leadership position within his Troop. Nick was a Brotherhood member of the Bob White Lodge #87 Order of the Arrow in which he served two terms as Lodge Registrar. Highlights of Nick's Scouting years include attending the 2005 National Jamboree at Fort A. P. Hill, VA; working three summers on Camp Staff in the Shooting Sports Area with the Georgia-Carolina Council; and attending the 2006 National Order of the Arrow Conference at Michigan State University. He was a member of the Lakeside High School Army Junior ROTC Unit where he had achieved the Rank of Sergeant. Nick's greatest passion in Scouting was the Order of the Arrow. He was able to attend two “Dixie” Conclaves that always ignited newfound passion for the Order and Scouting in general. He could not understand why some would not want this experience. In early summer of 2014, the Nicholas A. “Nick” Van Duyn Shooting Sports Pavilion was dedicated at Robert E. Knox Scout Reservation. This facility serves Shotgun and Tomahawk programs.
